Brief history: legislative steps at COM level

- COM statement in Regulation (EU) No 438/2010 (29/5/2010)
 The Commission has the intention to propose a revision of Regulation (EC) No 998/2003 in its entirety before 30 June 2011, and, in particular, the aspects of delegated and implementing acts.
- COM adopted COM(2012)89 final on <u>5 March 2012:</u>
 - repeals and replaces Regulation (EC) No 998/2003 of EP and Council;
 - aligns the powers conferred on COM under Regulation (EC)
 No 998/2003 with Articles 290 and 291 TFEU;
 - o clarifies the regime that applies from 1 January 2012, in particular as regards Articles 4(1), 6, 8 and 16 of Regulation (EC) No 998/2003.





Brief history: legislative steps at COM level

- COM adopted COM(2012)90 final on <u>5 March 2012:</u>
- o replaces in Articles 10 and 16 of Directive 92/65/EEC references to Regulation (EC) No 998/2003 by references to Regulation (EU) No 576/2013;
- o inserts reference to Regulation (EC) No 1/2005 in Article 10;
- o prohibits imports of unvaccinated dogs/cats/ferrets;
- extends the time limit from 24 to 48h before dispatch for the clinical examination;
- o clarifies the actors of the certification.





Brief history: legislative steps at Council and EP level

- Discussion at Council from <u>March to December 2012</u> (compromise text);
- Discussion with EP following rapporteur' report, from December 2012 until May 2013;
- Adoption by EP in May 2013, by Council in June 2013;
- Publications on <u>28 June 2013</u>:
- o 'Pet Regulation';
- o COM implementing Regulation regarding the identification documents, declarations and list of third countries;
- o Amendment of Directive 92/65/EEC;
- Publication on <u>23 October 2013</u>: COM Implementing Decisions regarding trade and import certificates.





Key dates and legal acts

- 28 June 2013: publication of
 - o Regulation (EU) No **576/2013** of EP and Council
 - o COM Implementing Regulation (EU) No **577/2013**
 - Directive 2013/31/EU of EP and Council amending Council Directive 92/65/EEC-balai Directive
- 23 October 2013: publication of
 - COM Implementing Decision 2013/518/EU (trade certificate)
 - COM Implementing Decision 2013/519/EU
 (import certificate and list of authorised third countries)

29 December 2014: applicability

Commission initiatives (2)

- New training in the framework of the Better Training for Safer Food Commission initiative started in December 2013
 - http://www.foodinfo-europe.com/training-programs/mdc-presentation
 - ✓ aiming at providing to Member States and certain third countries' veterinary services and customs' staff a common understanding of the EU legislation in relation to the cross-border movement of dogs and cats and its control (e.g. lectures/discussions on key concepts of "non-commercial", "trade" and "imports", practical sessions in TPE/BIPs);
 - ✓ training of trainers (dissemination of information, including training of authorised veterinarians)
 - ✓ 10 four-day workshops in 2013-2014 (after adoption of the new Pet Regulation); 310 participants from MSs, CH, NO, IS, MA, TN, B&H, IL, TR, UA, AL, EG, BY, RS...
 - ✓ 1 or 2 custom officers per workshop.

 New BTSF programme launched in 2015 (since the date of applicability of the new Pet Regulation)
